The Messianic secret: A characteristic of Mark's Gospel where Jesus does not wish to be recognised as the Messiah.

The titles of Jesus in Mark's Gospel

Christ (Messiah)- The 'anointed one'; a leader of the Jews who is expected to live on earth at some time in the future.

The Son of David-All Jewish men are Sons of David – named after King David. However, to be called the Son of David had messianic suggestions.

Son of Man- A title that could refer to either just a human being, or a human who is given power by God. A man who would suffer before bringing in God's Kingdom.

Son of God- A title used for Jesus the second person of the Trinity; denotes the special relationship between Jesus and God the Father.
